In March, 2015 the UCI announced it would revamp the Athletes' Commission as part of its renewed efforts to make the UCI a "more transparent and open organization." According to the UCI, the charge of the 13 member commission is to:

• improve the training and competition conditions for athletes;

continuing her efforts to make our sport more professional in every aspect."

- give riders the opportunity to have their say with the guarantee of being heard by the cycling family and its administration;
- allow the UCI to receive riders' opinions directly;
- reinforce the links between current or recently-retired athletes and the UCI.

"I'm very excited to be a part of the UCI athletes' commission, said Gould. The creation of this commission and the fact that the UCI has mandated equal representation of men and women really highlights the momentum that women's cycling is experiencing at this time. The fact that several members of the WCA are on the commission is evidence of the realization of the <a href="WCAs strategic goals">WCAs strategic goals</a> of having more women in leadership positions."

The WCA is a coalition of cyclists, across the globe, which supports the advancement and success of Women's Cycling, on both sporting and business levels.
